



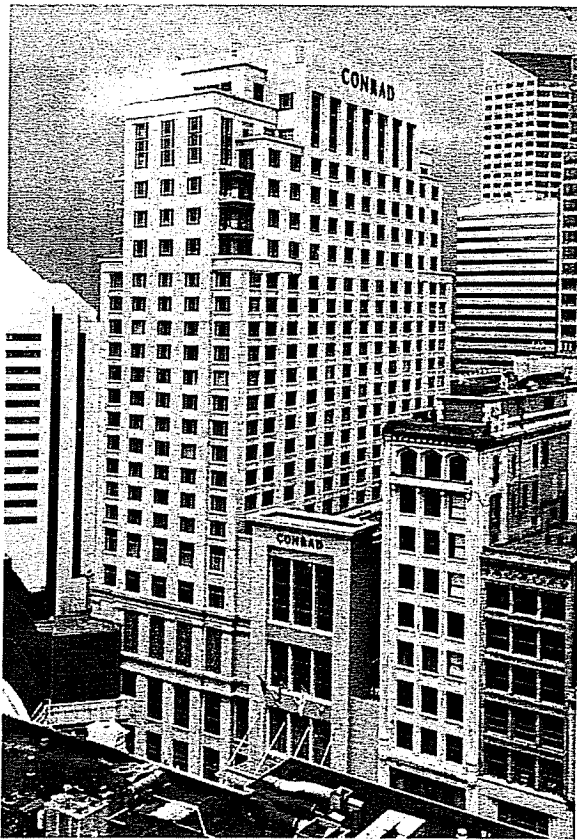

A Monumental Affair is the premiere design awards event in Indianapolis recognizing excellence amongst those who have contributed to the enhancement and beautification of Marion County through the built and natural environment in the categories of architecture, construction, downtown development, engineering, innovative reuse, interior design, landscape architecture, the Mayor's Neighborhood Awards, project/community development, and public art.

### program history

In 1977, the Awards for Excellence in Development were lead by the efforts of the Metropolitan Development Commission and the Division of Planning and Zoning.

Over the next decade the event was lead by the Commission for Downtown, and later Indianapolis Downtown, Inc. These efforts were joined by the local chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the state chapters of the American Society of Landscape Architects, the American Society of Interior Designers, and the International Interior Design Association.

In 1995, Keep Indianapolis Beautiful, Inc. assumed the program, adding the Mayor's Neighborhood Awards category. KIB was later joined by The Society for Marketing Professional Services to help promote, organize and enhance the program.

Since that time, the program has continuously expanded to include the construction industry, now represented by Indiana Construction Roundtable, and the engineering industry, represented by the American Council of Engineering Companies.

In 2005, public art was added as a category, and is sanctioned by the Indianapolis Cultural Development Commission.

Also new in 2005, was the "Inspiring Places Award," as a part of the Mayor's Neighborhood Awards. Underwritten by The Indianapolis Foundation, the \$1,000 award recognizes the community-based organization that through civic engagement most effectively enhanced the aesthetic of their community by making a defined space within it more inspiring.

This year, innovative reuse was added as a category. Innovative reuse is sanctioned by the Local Initiatives Support Corporation and honors those who work to preserve Indianapolis' past for future generations.

Tonight, we are honored to celebrate 30 years of A Monumental Affair by proudly showcasing the projects of an ever changing, ever improving Marion County.
